FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – April 2019

From April 1, 2019 through April 30, 2019, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 94%. The save rate for dogs was 95% and for cats it was 93%. *

April marks the 9th consecutive month that FBCAS has had a save rate of 90% or greater for our pets in the shelter.

• 53 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program for April 2019.

Dogs:

- The save rate does not include 2 dogs that were owner requested euthanasia (ORE) for the month of April 2019.
 - o Both ORE's were head to lab bite investigations for aggression within the home.
- Three additional dogs were humanely euthanized at FBCAS.
 - o Two dogs were humanely euthanized for extreme behavior issues, one was severely injured on intake after being hit by a car.
- Two dogs died in care.
 - o Both dogs died post surgery.
- Two dogs were lost in care.

Cats

- The save rate does not include 1 cat that was an owner requested euthanasia (ORE) for the month of April 2019.
 - o This cat was a head to lab bite investigation for aggression within the home.
- Four cats were humanely euthanized at FBCAS.
 - One Community cat was severely injured on intake and one Community cat was very ill
 on intake and they could not be released.
 - Two cats were severely injured on intake.
- Seven kittens died in care. All were underage and underweight and had upper respiratory infections.
- Two cats were lost in care.

Our dedicated staff would like to thank all of our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.
