FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – May 2021

From May 1, 2021 through May 31, 2021, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 93%. The save rate for dogs was 97% and for cats it was 91%. * The month of May saw 488 dogs and cats come into the shelter.

- 149 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 32 dogs and 7 cats were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.
- 190 spay/neuter surgeries were performed by our veterinary team.

Dogs:

- Three dogs were humanely euthanized for very aggressive behavior.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized for a head to lab bite investigations.

Cats:

- One cat died en route to the shelter after suffering injuries out in the field.
- One cat was humanely euthanized due to severe hit by car injuries.
- Two cats were humanely euthanized after being brought in with traumatic injuries.
- Three neonatal kittens died in foster – failure to thrive.
- Twelve neonatal kittens died due to failure to thrive in the shelter.
- Eight neonatal kittens were humanely euthanized coming into the shelter with severe injuries/illnesses prior to entering the shelter.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.

Since August 2018 FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets that come into our shelter. Our dedicated staff would like to thank all of our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.
