FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – November 2021

From November 1, 2021 through November 30, 2021, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 95%. The save rate for dogs was 94% and for cats it was 95%.*

- 146 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 26 dogs and 1 cat were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- One dog died en route after suffering severe injuries in the field.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized with hit by car injuries.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to severe illness.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to head to lab bite investigations.
- One dog was humanely euthanized due to severe injury.
- One dog was lost in care.

Cats:

- Two cats were humanely euthanized with hit by car injuries.
- Three neonatal kittens died in foster care for failing to thrive.
- Three kittens were humanely euthanized in shelter for failing to thrive.
- Two cats were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury.
- One cat was humanely euthanized due to a head to lab bite investigation.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
