FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – April 2022

From April 1, 2022 through April 30, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 96%. The save rate for dogs was 99% and for cats it was 92%. *

- 18 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 21 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- Three dogs were humanely euthanized for head to lab bite investigations.

Cats:

- Two adult cats died in care with severe injury and illness.
- One kitten died en route to the shelter with severe injuries.
- One kitten died on arrival with umbilical cord still attached.
- Two adult cats were humanely euthanized due to severe illness and injury.
- Two kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe illness and injury.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.

*Best Friends Community Dashboard formula: [(Live Intakes, including Owner Requested Euthanasia)-(Died in Care)-(Lost in Care)-(Shelter Euthanasia)-(Owner Requested Euthanasia)] divided by Live Intakes
