FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – July 2022

From July 1, 2022 through July 31, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 96%. The save rate for dogs was 98% and for cats it was 96%. *

- 71 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 25 dogs and 1 cat returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- Two dogs were humanely euthanized at the request of their owners for head to lab bite investigations.
- One dog was humanely euthanized for severe and repeated aggression towards staff and public.
- One dog died en route to the shelter after being hit by a car.
- Two puppies died from post-surgical complications.

Cats:

- Two neonatal kittens died in foster care (failure to thrive).
- One neonatal kittens died at the shelter (failure to thrive).
- Two kittens died shortly after coming in from injuries when picked up in the field.
- One kitten was humanely euthanized due to severe injuries when picked up in the field.
- One kitten was humanely euthanized due to severe illness while in foster care.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
