FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – May 2022

From May 1, 2022 through May 31, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 94%. The save rate for dogs was 98% and for cats it was 91%.*

- 57 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 24 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- Two dogs were humanely euthanized for head to lab bite investigations.
- One dog died en route to the shelter due to severe injuries.
- One dog died in kennel from unknown causes.
- One three day old puppy died on arrival.

Cats:

- One kitten died en route to the shelter with severe injuries.
- Six neonatal kittens died in foster care (failure to thrive).
- Six neonatal kittens died at the shelter (failure to thrive).
- Three adult cats were humanely euthanized due to severe illness and injury.
- Two kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe illness and injury.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
