FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – September 2022

From September 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 92%. The save rate for dogs was 92% and for cats it was 93%.*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 88 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 21 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- One dog died after a short illness in the shelter.
- Three newborn puppies died shortly after birth.
- Two neonatal stray puppies died in care (failure to thrive).
- Three neonatal puppies were humanely euthanized (failure to thrive).
- One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of their owner for a head to lab bite/behavior.
- One dog was humanely euthanized for a head to lab bite investigation.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to severe injuries in the field
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to severe illness.

Cats:

- One cat had already died in the field when the officer arrived.
- One cat was humanely euthanized after coming into the shelter with severe injuries.
- Nine neonatal kittens died due to failure to thrive (six in foster care and three at the shelter).

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.

Our dedicated staff would like to thank all of our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.
