FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – June 2023

From June 1, 2023 through June 30, 2023, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 90%. The save rate for dogs was 87% and for cats it was 92%. *

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 118 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- 6 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

Dogs:

- Three dogs died after sudden illnesses
- One senior dog died in fospice
- One dog was humanely euthanized – picked up with severe injuries
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized from bite investigations
- One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of their owner for a bite
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized for bites and or aggressive behavior towards the public and staff

Cats:

- Two cats died due to injuries suffered in the field
- Four neonatal kittens died in foster care
- Three kittens died due to injuries suffered in the field
- One cat was humanely euthanized from a bite investigation
- One cat was humanely euthanized due to severe illness
- Two kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe illness
- Two kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe injuries suffered in the field

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
