FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report –March 2024

From March 1, 2024 through March 31, 2024, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 91%. The save rate for dogs was 80% and for cats it was 98%.*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 118 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- 12 dogs and one cat were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

Dogs:

- · One puppy was humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries in the field
- · One dog was humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries in the field
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to severe illness
- · One dog was humanely euthanized for a head to lab bite investigation
- · Four dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public
- · Two neonate puppies died shortly after birth in foster care
- · Three dogs died from unknown causes in the kennel
- · One dog died post-surgery

Cats:

- · One cat was humanely euthanized due to severe illness
- · One neonatal kitten died shortly after birth
- · One cat died shortly after arriving at the shelter after a severe injury
