FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – May 2024

From May 1, 2024 through May 31, 2024, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 92%. The save rate for dogs was 87% and for cats it was 93%.*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 93 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- 16 dogs and cats were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

- · One cat was humanely euthanized as part of a head-to-lab bite investigation
- Three neonatal kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe illness
- Four kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe injury/illness

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
