FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – February 2020

From February 1, 2020 through February 29, 2020, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 99%. The save rate for dogs was 99.4% and for cats it was 96%.* The overall save rate for FBCAS utilizing the formula through the Best Friends Community Dashboard was 97%**

February 2020 marks the 19th consecutive month that Fort Bend County Animal Services has maintained a 90% or greater save rate for the pets that come into our shelter.

- 92 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program for February 2020.
- 1 dog and 1 cat were returned to their owners through our Return in Field program for February
 2020.

Dogs:

- · One dog was deceased on arrival and brought to the shelter.
- · Three dogs were humanely euthanized as part of head-to-lab bite investigations.
- One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of their owner for displaying severe aggression in the home and resulted in a head-to-lab bite investigation.

Cats:

- · One TNR cat died shortly after arriving at shelter after being brought in injured in a trap.
- * Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.

- *Formula used to include Owner Requested Euthanasia and head to lab bite investigations: Intake minus all euthanasia outcomes divided by intake minus owner requested euthanasia
