FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – November 2020

From November 1, 2020 through November 31, 2020, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 92%. The save rate for dogs was 99% and for cats it was 87%.*

- · 99 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 22 dogs and 2 cats were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.
- · 187 spay/neuter surgeries were performed by our veterinary team.

Dogs:

One dog was lost in care.

Cats:

- · Nine kittens/neonatals died due to failure to thrive.
- Five adult cats were humanely euthanized for severe injuries suffered out in the field after being hit by cars.
- Four kittens were humanely euthanized that were brought in with severe illnesses and injuries.
- · One cat was humanely euthanized due to a severe illness.

Since August 2018 FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets that come into our shelter. Our dedicated staff would like to thank all of our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.

*Best Friends Community Dashboard formula: [(Live Intakes, including Owner Requested Euthanasia)-(Died in Care)-(Lost in Care)-(Shelter Euthanasia)-(Owner Requested Euthanasia)] divided by Live Intakes
