FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – April 2021

From April 1, 2021 through April 30, 2021, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 96%. The save rate for dogs was 94% and for cats it was 97%.*

- · 155 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 33 dogs and 7 cats were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.
- 222 spay/neuter surgeries were performed by our veterinary team.

Dogs:

- One dog was deceased on arrival at the shelter due to suspected hit by car injuries.
- One dog was humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries when brought in.
- Three dogs were humanely euthanized at the request of their owners for very aggressive behavior in the home.
- One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of its owner for being deemed a dangerous dog.
- Three dogs were humanely euthanized for a head to lab bite investigations.

Cats:

- Three cats were humanely euthanized after coming in with severe injuries.
- · One community cay was humanely euthanized that was brought in extremely ill.
- Two kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe injuries when brought in.

Since August 2018 FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets that come into our shelter. Our dedicated staff would like to thank all of our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.
