FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – June 2021

From June 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 93%. The save rate for dogs was 94% and for cats it was 92%.* The month of June saw 540 dogs and cats come into the shelter.

- · 207 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- · 36 dogs and 1 cat were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- · Three dogs were humanely euthanized for aggressive behavior.
- · Two dogs were humanely euthanized for a head to lab and bite investigations.
- · Two puppies were humanely euthanized that came in with severe illness from foster care.
- · Four puppies died after returning from foster with severe illnesses.
- · One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of their owner for severe aggression.

Cats:

- · Six neonatal kittens died due to failure to thrive in foster care.
- Ten neonatal kittens died due to failure to thrive in the shelter.
- · Four kittens were humanely euthanized after coming into the shelter with severe illness.
- · Four cats were humanely euthanized after coming into the shelter with severe injuries.
- Two community cats were humanely euthanized after their coming into the shelter with severe injuries.

Since August 2018 FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets that come into our shelter. Our dedicated staff would like to thank all of our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.
