FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report - March 2021

From March 1, 2021 through March 31, 2021, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 97%. The save rate for dogs was 95% and for cats it was 98%.*

- · 208 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 43 dogs and 4 cats were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.
- · 277 spay/neuter surgeries were performed by our veterinary team.

Dogs:

- One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of its owner due to age and severe illness.
- One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of its owner due to severe illness.
- · One dog was humanely euthanized after suffering traumatic injuries in the field.
- · One dog died in its kennel of unknown causes.
- · One dog died post-surgery.
- One dog was humanely euthanized for a head to lab bite investigation.

Cats:

- Three cats were humanely euthanized after coming in with hit by car injuries.
- · One community cay was humanely euthanized that was brought in extremely ill.
- · One senior cat was humanely euthanized that was brought in extremely ill.
- · One kitten was humanely euthanized due to severe illness.

Since August 2018 FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets that come into our shelter. Our dedicated staff would like to thank all of our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.
