## FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – August 2022

From August 1, 2022 through August 31, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 96.5%. The save rate for dogs was 95% and for cats it was 98%.\*

With the save rate this month, FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care for 48 consecutive months beginning in August 2018.

- 154 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 21 dogs and 1 cat returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

## Dogs:

- Six dogs were humanely euthanized at the request of the Court.
- One dog died en route to the shelter after being in a car during an accident.
- One puppy died in care (newborn failure to thrive).
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized at the request of their owners for Head-to-Lab bite investigations.
- One dog was euthanized at the request of their owner for bite/behavior.
- One dog was euthanized for a bite investigation.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized for multiple bites/aggression with staff/volunteers in shelter.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to severe injuries in the field
- One dog was humanely euthanized after suffering post-surgical complications.

## Cats:

- One cat died shortly after coming in from injuries when picked up in the field.
- Three cats were humanely euthanized after coming into the shelter with severe injuries.
- One kitten died in care after failing to thrive.

\* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
