FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report –December 2022

From December 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 97%. The save rate for dogs was 98% and for cats it was 97%.*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 61 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- · 14 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- One dog died of unknown causes
- One dog was humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries in the field
- · Four dogs were humanely euthanized for head-to-lab bite investigations
- Two dogs was humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public.

Cats:

- · Three cats were humanely euthanized due to severe injuries suffered in the field
- · One kitten was humanely euthanized due to severe injuries suffered in the field
