FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – January 2022

From January 1, 2022 through January 31, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 96%. The save rate for dogs was 97% and for cats it was 96%.*

- 128 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 30 dogs and 3 cat were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- Two dogs were humanely euthanized for aggressive behavior towards public and staff.
- One dog was humanely euthanized due to head to a lab bite investigation.
- One dog was humanely euthanized at the owners request for aggressive behavior.
- One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of the court during a dangerous dog investigation.

Cats:

- Two cats were humanely euthanized with hit by car injuries.
- Two community cats were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury.
- One cat was humanely euthanized due to severe injuries in the field.
- One cat was humanely euthanized due to a head to lab bite investigation.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
