FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – June 2022

From June 1, 2022 through June 30, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 94%. The save rate for dogs was 97% and for cats it was 91%.*

- 77 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- 25 dogs and 1 cat returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- Three dogs were humanely euthanized at the request of their owners for head to lab bite investigations.
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized for severe and repeated aggression towards staff and public.
- One dog died from post surgical complications.
- One dog died during surgery.

Cats:

- Seven neonatal kittens died in foster care (failure to thrive).
- Five neonatal kittens died at the shelter (failure to thrive).
- One senior cat died in care from severe illness.
- Two adult cats were humanely euthanized due to severe illness and injury.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
