## FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – November 2022

From November 1, 2022 through November 30, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 97%. The save rate for dogs was 98% and for cats it was 97%.\*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 59 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- · 11 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

## Dogs:

- · One newborn puppy died in foster failure to thrive
- · One dog was picked up already deceased in the field
- One dog died from post-surgical complications
- · One dog died in kennel from unknown causes shortly after arrival
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized for head-to-lab bite investigations, one at the owner's request
- One dog was humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public.
- · One dog was humanely euthanized for severe aggression at the request of its owner
- · One dog was humanely euthanized by court order

## Cats:

- · One kitten died in shelter failure to thrive
- · One senior cat died in fospice
- · Two neonatal kittens died in foster failure to thrive
- · Two cats were humanely euthanized due to severe injuries suffered in the field
- · One kitten was humanely euthanized due to severe injuries suffered in the field
