FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – October 2022

From October 1, 2022 through October 31, 2022, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 91%. The save rate for dogs was 88% and for cats it was 91%.*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 67 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program.
- · 13 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs.

Dogs:

- · Six newborn puppies died shortly after birth.
- · One severely ill puppy was humanely euthanized (failure to thrive).
- · One dog was humanely euthanized due to severe injuries in the field
- One dog was humanely euthanized for multiple bites.
- · Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public.

Cats:

- · One kitten was humanely euthanized for severe illness.
- · Eight neonatal kittens died due to failure to thrive (one in foster care and seven at the shelter).
- * Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.

Our dedicated staff would like to thank all of our adopters, rescue partners, fosters, volunteers and community members who played a part in every life saved at FBCAS this month.
