FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report –January 2023

From January 1, 2023 through January 31, 2023, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 93%. The save rate for dogs was 90% and for cats it was 97%.*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- · 60 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- · 24 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

Dogs:

- · One dog died shortly after arrival with severe injuries suffered in the field
- · One dog was humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public
- One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of its owner for a head-to-lab bite investigation
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized after a bite quarantine
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized for as a result of a seizure warrant and investigation
- Three dogs were humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries in the field

Cats:

Two cats were humanely euthanized due to severe injuries suffered in the field

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
