FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – July 2023

From July 1, 2023 through July 31, 2023, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 92%. The save rate for dogs was 93% and for cats it was 91%.*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 86 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- · 3 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

Dogs:

- · Three dogs died after sudden illnesses
- One dog was humanely euthanized for bites and or aggressive behavior towards the public and staff

Cats:

- · Seven neonatal kittens died in foster care
- · One cat was humanely euthanized at the request of its owner for a bite investigation
- · One cat was humanely euthanized due to severe illness
- One kitten was humanely euthanized due to severe illness
- · Two kittens were humanely euthanized due to severe injuries suffered in the field
