## FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – September 2023

From September 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023, the overall save rate was 95%. The save rate for dogs it was 89% and for cats it was 99%

As we move forward though, we need your help more than ever to continue to keep our save rate at 90% or more. We are in a crisis situation unlike any we have seen here before and we need your help to adopt and foster. Please help us to help them.

- · 65 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- · 7 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

## Dogs:

- · One dog passed away shortly arriving at the shelter after suffering injury in the field.
- · Two dogs were humanely euthanized after suffering from severe injury in the filed
- · Four dogs were humanely euthanized for bites and or aggressive behavior towards the public and staff
- · Two dogs were humanely euthanized for bite investigations

## Cats:

- · Two cats were humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries in the field
- \* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
