FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – February 2024

From February 1, 2024 through February 29, 2024, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 94%. The save rate for dogs was 88% and for cats it was 98%.*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 132 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- 17 dogs and one cat were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

Dogs:

- · One puppy was humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries in the field
- One dog died of unknown causes post-surgery
- · One dog was humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries in the field
- · One senior dog was humanely euthanized due to severe illness
- · Two dogs died shortly after arrival with severe injuries suffered in the field
- · Six dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public

Cats:

· One cat was humanely euthanized due to severe illness
