FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report –January 2024

From January 1, 2024 through January 31, 2024, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 96%. The save rate for dogs was 92% and for cats it was 100%.*

FBCAS has maintained a 90% or more save rate for the pets in our care since August 2018.

- 107 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- 13 dogs and one cat were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

Dogs:

- One puppy was humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries in the field
- One dog was humanely euthanized after suffering severe injuries in the field
- Two dogs died shortly after arrival with severe injuries suffered in the field
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized at the request of its owner for a head-to-lab bite investigations
- Four dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.
