FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – September 2024

From September 1, 2024 through September 30, 2024, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 93%. The save rate for dogs was 91% and for cats it was 94%.*

Since August 2018, FBCAS has maintained a 90% save rate for the pets entering our shelter.

- 101 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program
- · 8 dogs were returned to their owners through our Return to Owner/Return in Field programs

Dogs:

- · One puppy died of unknown causes
- · One puppy was humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury
- · One dog was humanely euthanized at the request of its owner as part of a bite investigation
- Two dogs were humanely euthanized as part of head to lab bite investigations
- · Two dogs were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury
- Three dogs were humanely euthanized due to aggression towards staff and public

Cats:

- · Two neonatal kittens died in shelter failure to thrive
- · One kitten died en route to the shelter due to severe illness
- · Five cats were humanely euthanized due to severe illness or injury
